Mrs. Mary Lois Treadaway, of Morrow died April 29, 2015 in Arizona where she was convalescing after being injured in a fall. Ms. Treadaway was born on Christmas Day, 1929 in Carroll County, GA to Allen and Eva Conner. Ms. Treadaway's mother passed away when Ms. Treadaway was four years old.
